The children will be encouraged NOT TO STOP during this time but to keep moving-(slowing to a walk is fine) so you are sponsoring them to complete their time.


Don't forget their water bottle on the day and we will provide a nice cool ice pop for all classes on finishing.

NSPCC assembly and non-uniform day

The NSPCC are visiting the school on **Thursday 26**th **April** to deliver age appropriate assemblies on how to "speak out, stay safe" to Reception and KS1 and KS2. The NSPCC - the National Society for the prevention of Cruelty to Children is a charity supporting children in need - see their website for more information. Speak out Stay safe is a programme that gives a generation of children the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe from abuse and neglect.
